

## NEW PROGRAM ELEMENT CODE (PEC) DEFINITIONS FOR FY02

### 1. Program Element CONUS 86276/OCONUS 86376 - Facilities Restoration and Modernization Health Care

**Definition:** Facilities Restoration and Modernization Health Care. Provides resources for improving an inventory of medical facilities and installations with a primary mission of health care. Restoration includes repair and replacement work to restore damaged facilities due to accident or failure attributable to inadequate sustainment, excessive age, or other causes. Modernization includes alteration of facilities to implement a new, higher standard (including regulatory changes), to accommodate new functions, or to replace building components that typically last more than 50 years (such as foundations and structural components). Restoration and modernization does not include recurring sustainment tasks or certain environmental measures (such as removal of asbestos and lead paint), which are funded elsewhere. Other tasks associated with facilities operations (such as custodial services, grass cutting, and the provision of central utilities) are also not included. Excludes Army and Air Force contingency hospitals, Navy fleet hospitals, and Navy fleet hospital storage facilities.

### 2. Program Element CONUS 86278/OCONUS 86378 - Facilities Sustainment Health Care

**Definition:** Facilities Sustainment - Health Care. Provides resources for maintenance and repair activities necessary to keep an inventory of medical facilities and installations with a primary mission of health care in good working order. It includes regularly scheduled adjustments and inspections, preventive maintenance tasks, and emergency response and service calls for minor repairs. It also includes major repairs or replacement of facility components (usually accomplished by contract) that are expected to occur periodically throughout the life cycle of facilities. This work includes regular roof replacement, refinishing of wall surfaces, repairing and replacement of heating and cooling systems, replacing tile and carpeting, and similar types of work. It does not include certain restoration, modernization, and environmental compliance

costs which are funded elsewhere. Other tasks associated with facilities operations (such as custodial services, grass cutting, landscaping, waste disposal, and the provision of central utilities) are also not included. Excludes Army and Air Force contingency hospitals, Navy fleet hospitals, and Navy fleet hospital storage facilities.

**3. Base Communication Health Care - Program Element CONUS 87795/OCONUS 87995.**

**Definition:** Includes manpower authorizations, peculiar and support equipment, necessary facilities and the associated costs specifically identified in CONUS/OCONUS and measurable to the following: Army: Base communications resources in support of Army medical activities. Includes non-tactical, non-DCS base (post, camp and station) communications facilities, and equipment systems, which provide local communications worldwide to installations/activities.

**4. Base Operation Health Care (BASOPS) - Program Element CONUS 87796/OCONUS 87996**

**Definition:** Includes manpower authorizations, peculiar and support equipment, necessary facilities and the associated costs specifically identified and measurable to the following functional categories of effort at CONUS/OCONUS medical and dental facilities, Medical Centers, medical support activities, and medical installations.  
**Administration:** Installation Headquarters Administration and Command (including squadron level responsible for Base Operations), Installation Comptroller services, Installation ADP services, Installation Information Activities, Installation Legal Activities, Installation Civilian Personnel Administration, Installation Military Personnel Administration, Installation Printing and Reproduction, Installation Safety, Installation Management Analysis/Management Engineering. **Retail Supply Operations:** Installation Supply Activities, Installation Procurement Operations, and Installation Storage Activities.

Maintenance of Installation Equipment (includes maintenance of administrative aircraft, vehicles and equipment but excludes maintenance of tactical equipment, combat vehicles and mission aircraft.) Other Base Services: Installation Transportation Activities; Installation Training (excludes troop training and tactical exercises), Installation Physical Security and Police Activities, Laundry and Dry Cleaning (for troop support and other appropriated fund activities), Bachelor Housing Operations and Furnishings (management, housing assignment, care of quarters, provisions, care, preservation and maintenance of furnishing, etc.). Other Personnel Support: Installation Food Service, Social Actions, Community Services, Chaplains, Bands (excluding The Army Band and Division Bands), Morale, Welfare and Recreation. Excludes the following functional categories which are part of the standard definition of Base Operations Support, but are reported under separate PEs: Maintenance and Repair of Real Property, Real Property Services, Minor Construction, Base Community.

**NEW ARMY MANAGEMENT STRUCTURE CODES  
FOR ANTITERRORISM FY02**

847724.80 Antiterrorism - Report only those funds expended for military and civilian in support of antiterrorism activities for US Army Medical Command hospitals or installations.

847724.81 Physical Security Equipment - Any item, device, or system that is used primarily for the protection of assets, personnel, information, or facilities to include alarms, sensors, protective lighting and their control systems, military working dogs, and the assessment of the reliability, accuracy, timeliness and effectiveness of those systems, such as: lighting systems; access controls and alarms systems; office/residential security equipment; personal body armor, individual protective equipment, and explosive detection devices.

847724.82 Physical Security Site Improvements - Any facility improvements (using O&M funding) or new construction whose purpose is to protect DoD assets, personnel, or information to include walls, fences, barricades, or other fabricated or natural impediments to restrict, limit, delay or deny entry into a Defense installation or facility such as: communication systems (close circuit television); installation perimeter barriers, vehicle barriers; blast mitigation devices; mylar, fragment retention film, and interior barriers; safe havens; evacuation facilities; and surveillance platforms.

847724.83 Physical Security Management and Planning - Personnel who manage physical security programs, resources, and assets such as, but not limited to headquarters staff.

847724.84 Security Forces/Technicians - All personnel and operating costs associated with protective forces whose primary or supporting mission is to safeguard assets, personnel or information. Included are costs for: salaries, overtime, benefits, materials, supplies, travel, support equipment, facilities, training, communications equipment, and management, for the personnel engaged in the following activities such as: dedicated response forces and security forces; locksmiths; perimeter, installation or facility access control; inspection and maintenance of barriers and security system components; antiterrorism

training for security forces; and antiterrorism awareness programs and training. Includes contract guards.

847724.85 Law Enforcement - All personnel and operating costs associated with law enforcement to include, salaries, overtime, benefits, material and supplies, equipment and facilities, vehicles, training, communications equipment, and management, such as: protective service details, including advance work; response forces; and military police. Provides services for protection of people and property, enforcement of laws, and maintenance of order, conduct traffic, and special event enforcement; civil liaison with civil law enforcement agencies. Prepare and distribute military police reports and related documents.

847724.86 Security and Investigative Matters - Includes Defense criminal investigative resources, conduct of vulnerability assessments (periodic high level reviews and physical security assessments), security and intelligence activities, and any cross-discipline security functions which do not easily fit into other security categories such as: terrorism investigations; executive antiterrorism training; surveillance and counter surveillance teams; protective service details including advance work; route surveys; and antiterrorism awareness programs and training.

847724.90 Terrorism Consequence Management - The DoD preparedness and response for mitigating the consequences of a terrorist incident including the use of a weapon of mass destruction. The DoD terrorism consequence management activities are designed to support the lead federal agency and include measures to alleviate damage, loss of life, hardship or suffering caused by the incident; protect public health and safety; and restore emergency essential government services. (Report only funds expended in support of consequence management for US Army Medical Command hospitals or installations.)

847724.92 Terrorism Consequence Management Response - Special Response Units of military and DoD civilian personnel that assist in the medical detection, neutralization, containment and management of biological or chemical warfare casualties. Team such as: Chemical/Biological Rapid Response Team (CB-RRT). Coordinates and manages the DoD technical capabilities necessary to respond to a chemical/biological (CB) terrorist incident; US Army Medical Research Institute of

Chemical Defense (USAMRICD), Medical Chemical Biological Advisory Team (MCBAT). Provides the primary source of medical information dealing with the management of chemical warfare agent casualties for the federal government; and US Army Radiological Advisory Medical Team (RAMT) is specially trained in radiological health matters. Installation Preparedness involves the planning and training necessary to identify and mitigate vulnerabilities to WMD events using Joint Staff tools (e.g., the Installation Planning Template and its WMD Annex). Also includes research development, test and evaluation conducted by US Army Medical Research Institute of Infectious Diseases (USAMRIID) that develops strategies, products, procedures, and training programs for medical defense against biological warfare threats and infectious diseases.
